Why should I take the time to complete this survey?

• Your answers will form the basis for an Open Space and Recreation Plan for Warwick and help the Town as it continues to develop land-use policies and priorities for town government's use in planning for future growth and protecting our natural, scenic and historic resources—all of the things that make Warwick a special place to live. The plan will help Warwick qualify for federal and state funding for land protection. All responses are anonymous.

What is Open Space?

• Open space is public or privately owned, undeveloped lands that are important to Warwick residents for a variety of reasons, including recreation, agriculture, forestry, wildlife habitat, or simply because of their scenic qualities and contribution to the overall character of our Town.
